The following data taken from a record of William Henry Lebkicher, it having been translated from the original by John Bear:

John Henry Bear immigrated from Switzerland in 1719 and took up land on south branch of Mill Creek, Lancaster County, Pa. His nearest neighbor, Andrew Fretter, had settled on adjoining land in 1717. John Henry Bear's brother Jacob immigrated seven years later and took up land land adjoining Henry on the west.

Henry Bear had three sons, namely:

Martin, who inherited the western part of the plantation { ... prof. Mw13,1793

George, youngest, who inherited the homestead and died there 1811.


Andrew Bear (Sr) was born on the old plantation in 1724 and died in Lancaster two Nov 9, 1815, age 90 years 9months 8 days. He is buried at Hellers Reformed Church, Lancaster County, Pa. Andrew Baer and his wife Christina Baer had 150 acres of land conveyed them by the Penns Dec 27, 1764. Andrew Sr's will probated Nov, 1815.

Andrew Bear (Sr) sold the tract of land in Earl township to his brother George and Andrew purchased a large tract which is now Bareville. It recently consisted of three farms and small tracts along the pike. Andrew Baer Sr's son, Andrew Baer, Jr, lived and died on the farm mmmm owned by Hershey Groff.

Andrew Baer, Jr, son of Andrew Sr. and Christina, was born and the correct death date is 1804, however after his father made his will. Andrew Baer, Jr, Married Mary Showers and they had the following children:

- Mary Bear, b. April 23, 1795, sign of the Mountain Goat, married Martin Meixel (3d) on Feb 20, 1814, d. Sep 25, 1849 and had children Matilda, Isaiah, Mary Ann (Lebkicher), Eliza and Andrew B. Meixel.
- John Bear, b. Jan 31, 1797, of Bear's Almanac fame, sign of the fishes, m. Miss Rine and had children Reuben, Andrew, Alfred and Rhine C. Bear. (Further note which may fit here is: Rueben L Baer, son of John Baer, his widow Mary L Baer Died Feb 21, 1916.)
- Sarah Bear, b. Sep 30, 1798, sign of the Twins, married Mr. Streng and had one boy three girls.
- Jacob Bear, b. July 8, 1800, sign of the Water-bearer, married
 Miss Buck and had children William, Henry, Samuel,
 Andrew, Albert and three girls.
- Andrew Bear, b. April 13, 1802, sign of the Virgin, m. Miss
 Lampkey and had children Emma m. Mr Kreider; Sarah m.
 Chas Fraily; Ella m. Hiram Keller; Maria Karmeny;
 Henriette m. Beitzel; Abner, Nathan and William.

Mary Bear married Martin Meixel, 3d, who was a descendant of Martin Meixel, one of the early pioneers of Leacock twp, Lancaster County, Pa. The pioneer was born Nov 10, 1713; died June 3, 1789; buried in the vicinity of Salem or Hellers German Reformed Church. In 1775 he was a large holder of land, as that was the date of his patent from the Penns. He emigrated from Germany about 1725; married Barbara Bushong, descended of French Huguenots, and located along both sides of the pike between Mechanicsburg and Bareville. Martin and Barbara Meixel had six children, John, Jacob, Julianna, Martin 2d, Andrew and Christian. Martin 2d and his elder brothers, John and Jacob belonged to Captain Rowland's Company July 5, 1775, being among the first to take up arms. Also in 1780 we find four of the Bioneer's sons, now including Andrew, in Captain Hueys Company. In the same was enrolled Martin Bare, Jr, a relative of Mary Bear.

Mertin Meixel, 2d, was either born 1756 and died Nov 20, 1823 or he was born in 1747. He married Rebecca Rhine who was born Apr 7, 1756 and died Septl 17, 1834. They had seven children; George; Sarah m. Mr Eaby; Martin Meixel, 3d;m. Mary Bear; Leah m. Mr. Moyer; Mary m. Mr. Kling; Catherine m. Mr. Ruth, and Hannah m.

Mary Ann Meixel, b. Sep 22, 186 1818; d. May 20, 1906. Born in Lancaster county and her parents died when she was quite young. She was a member of Holy Trinity Church, Lancaster and a Sunday-school teacher there for many years. Rev John C. Baker officiated at her marriage on June 21, 1843, to David M Lebkicher. DavidMLebkicher was a descendant of Henry Lebkicher who emigrated to America NM on the ship Lydia, Sept 20, 1743. Henry Lebkicher located close to what is ship Lydia, Sept 20, 1743. Henry Lebkicher located close to what is now the city of Lebanon, where Michael Lebkicher, 17-year-old soldier of the Revolution, was born. Michael Lebkicher, 4. Mad 7,1760; d. pm 27,1848

He soon after went to Lancaster, where he acquired land at South Queen and German Streets. David married twice; first Elizabeth McGrann, Feb 20, 1796-Feb 17, 1833, married on Dec. 12, 1812; second Catharine Bard, Apr 15, 1809-Jan 6 1847, married on Nov 12, 1833. He had fine children by his first marriage; Michael, David M., Eliza Amm, Margt F, Susan E, Mary Jane, Sarah Amm, Bernard M and Philip Richard. Of these David M, b. Sep 22, 1815;d. Nov. 13 1867, married Mary Ann Meixel. They lived at the corner of South Queen and German Sts, Lancasper. The father, David, was elected Recorder of Lancaster County in 1842 on a Whig ticket. His son, David M was appointed Deputy Recorder, a postion he held for some years after his father's term expired. David M. also was a teller in one of the Lancaster banks. Pather and son died within a day of each other of Cholera. The children of David M arranged for Mary Ann Lebkicher (nee Meixel) to occupy one-half of the double house at min 150 South Queen St and to derive the rent of the other half for her maintenance.
